New Guardianship Forms Demo Set for December 7th

The Sixth Judicial Circuit Court recently approved new Guardianship Reporting forms under [Administrative Order No. 2009-036](#). The updated court-approved forms will be more user friendly, perform extra calculations and are expected to reduce the amount of duplicate data entries.

Guardians and Guardianship Attorneys are expected to start using the new forms starting January 1, 2017. In an effort to help everyone get acquainted with the forms, the Clerk's office is offering a helpful demonstration. All attendees of this free event will receive a manual detailing how to use the forms to get their reports approved by the court.

The demonstration of the new forms will be held on:
